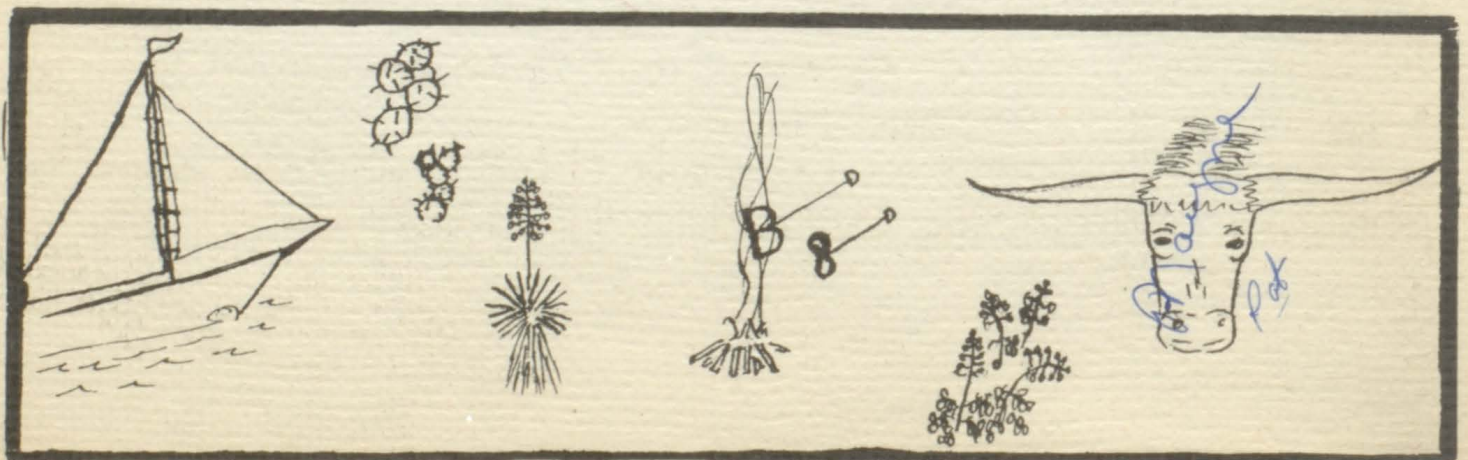
## Foreword

# DEDICATION



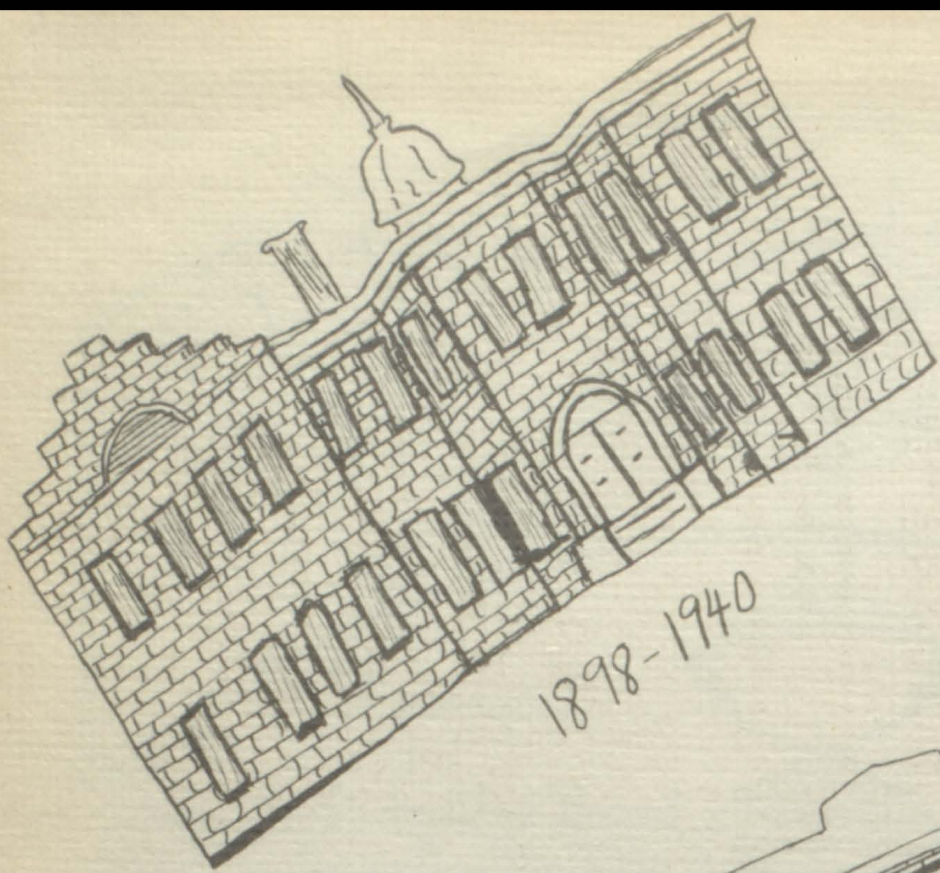
Down through the years the athletes of Burnet High School have taken the name "Burnet Bulldogs" because it exemplifies courage, strength, and valor.

As District Champions of 1945, the Bulldogs won admiration, not only from our school and community, but from each contesting team for their clean sportsmanship and fair play.

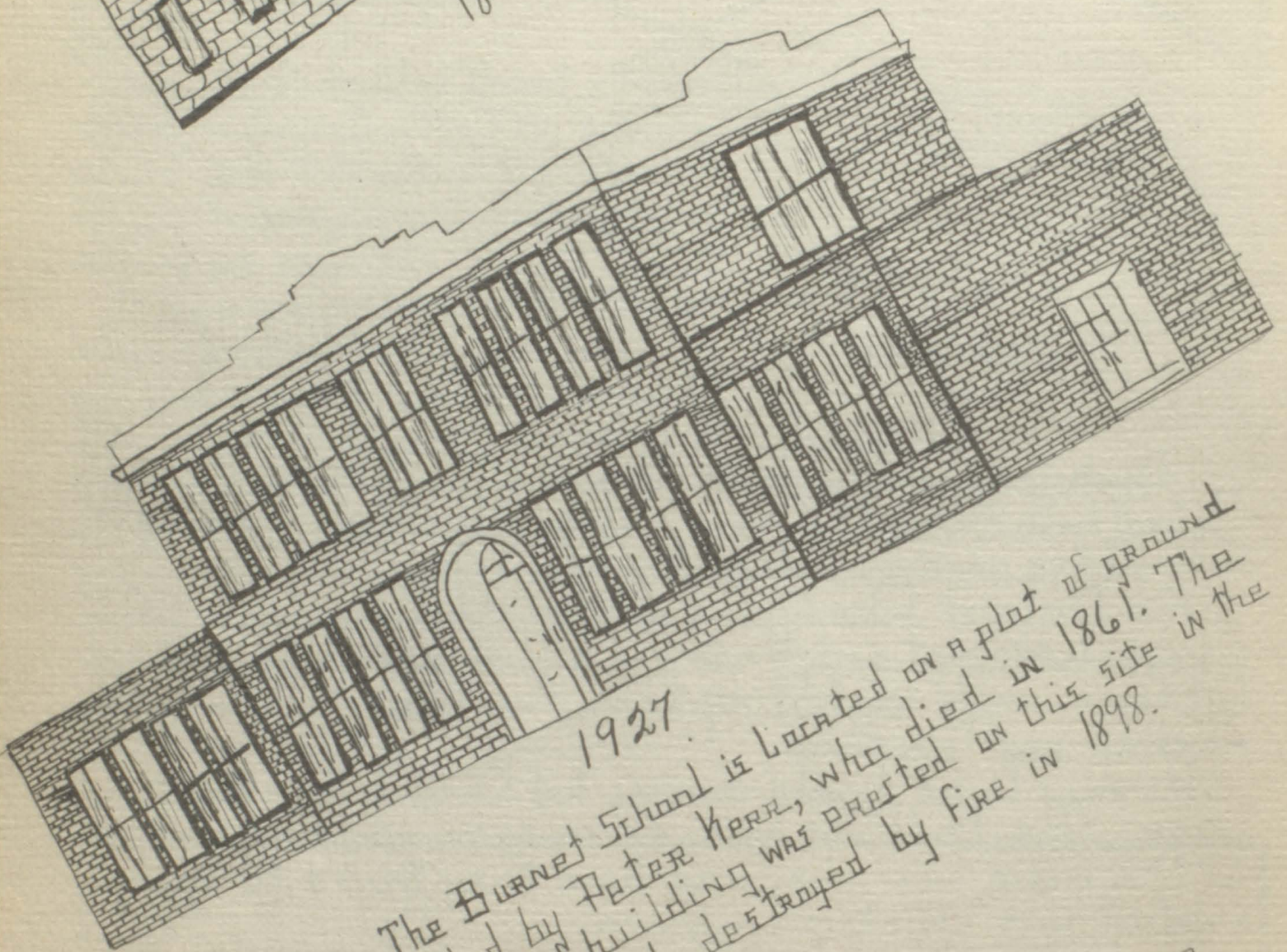

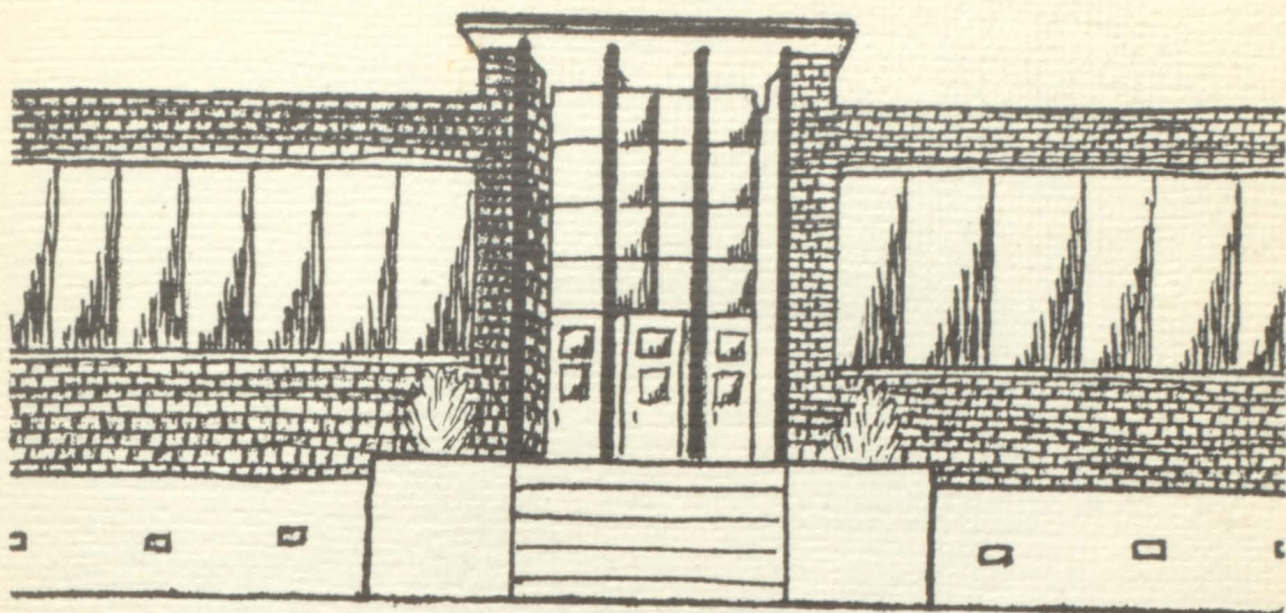

From the first two-story rock structure erected in the early 1870's, where two or three teachers were employed, our school has grown until it now occupies two modern brick buildings, employs twenty-four teachers, and has an enrollment of approximately seven hundred students. Five school buses are operated daily transporting students to and from school. Recent additions are a modern lunchroom and a V. A. workshop and classroom.

Our school now has thirty-four affiliated credits, and is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

Burnet High School believes that a well-balanced program of education emphasizes personal growth, development of special interest and skills, independence of thought, and disciplined democratic action. 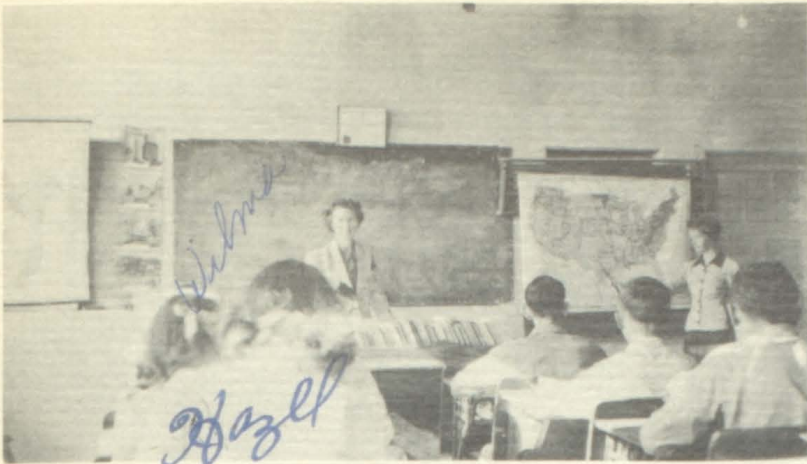
By keeping our eyes and ears open, we've been able to catch a few of the numerous remarks and comments from the various classes in High School.

Our Homemaking department is founded on the idea that the home is and shall continue to be the basic social unit in American life.

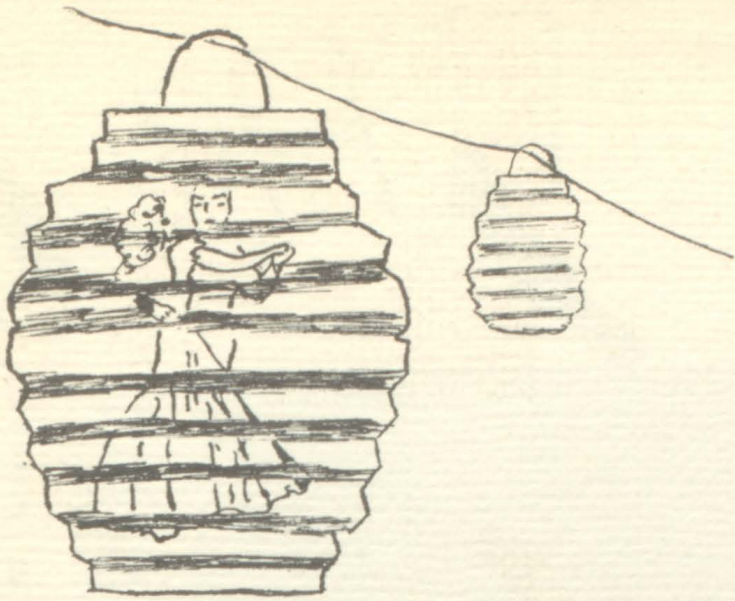
This division includes courses in Nutrition, Clothing, Child Care, Economics of the Household, Consumers Education and Personal Appearance.

The program of commercial studies includes courses designed to meet the needs of students who desire to acquire sufficient knowledge in this field to qualify them to hold business positions.

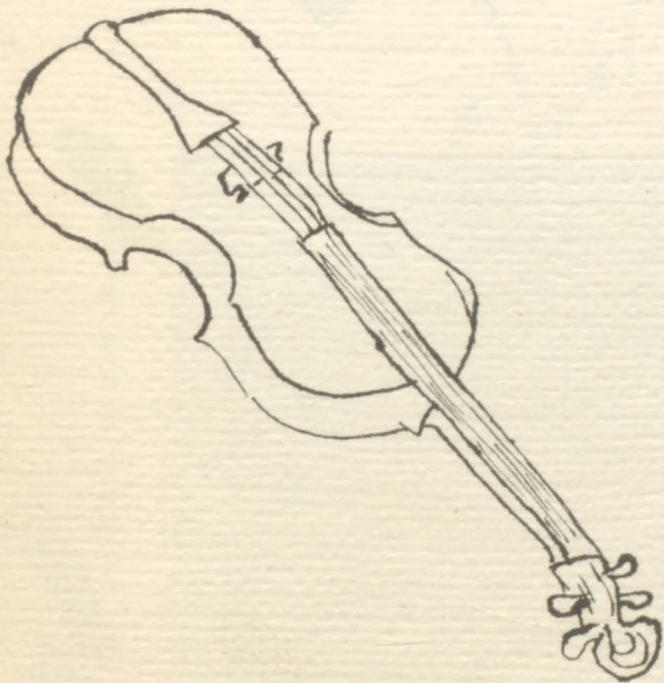
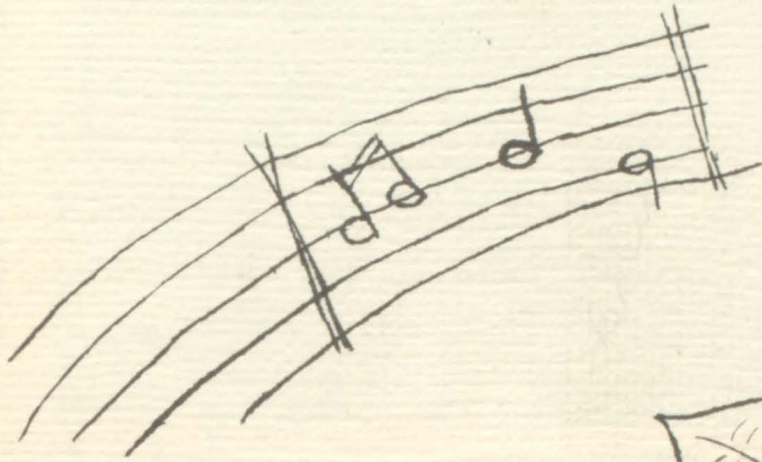
