Mary Sue is Vice President of the Junior Class while Jo Helen is secretary, and also an outstanding President of the Homemaking Club.

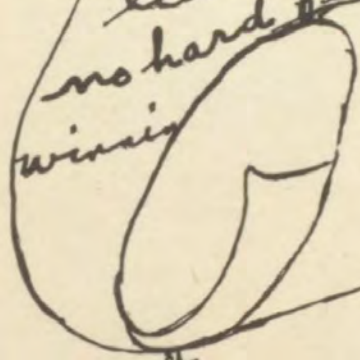
