Last year's award went to James Sheppard. This year it is Derrell Cowan. Gordon Gilmore was a very close second.



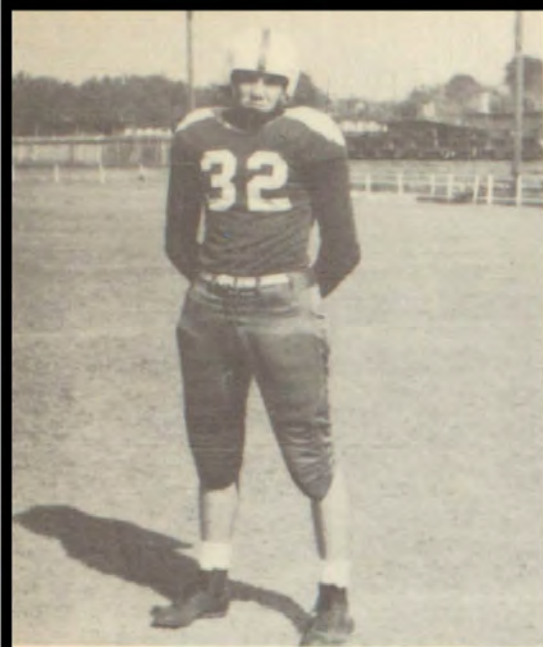
