Many people ask, "What is National Honor Society?" The National Honor Society (NHS) is a nationwide organization for high school students in the United States and outlying territories, which consists of many chapters in high schools. Selection is based on four criteria: scholarship (academic achievement), leadership, service, and character. The National Honor Society was founded in 1921 by the National Association of Secondary School Principals. Local schools develop their own criteria for service, and at BHS, new members are required to perform 12 hours of community service and one service project, while returning members are required to do 24 community service hours and participate in three service projects. Members must have an academic average of a 90.0 or higher and have excellent teacher recommendations. As a group this year, NHS members participated in Adopt an Angel aimed at helping local families The Tree Lighting Ceremony, and the Easter Egg Hunt for the Head Start Program. They also meet twice a month for information and planning sessions, and generally commit to shining a light on service and excellent community citizenship.

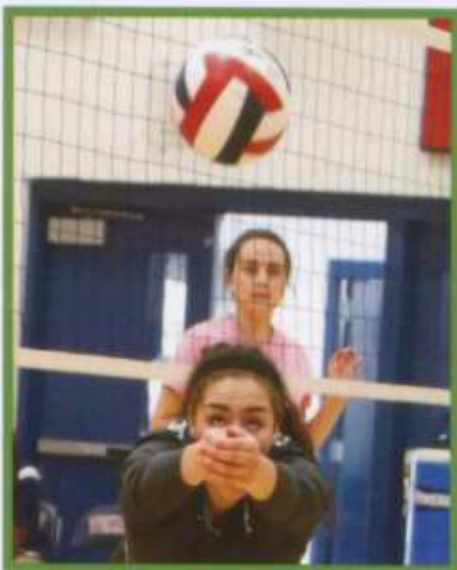

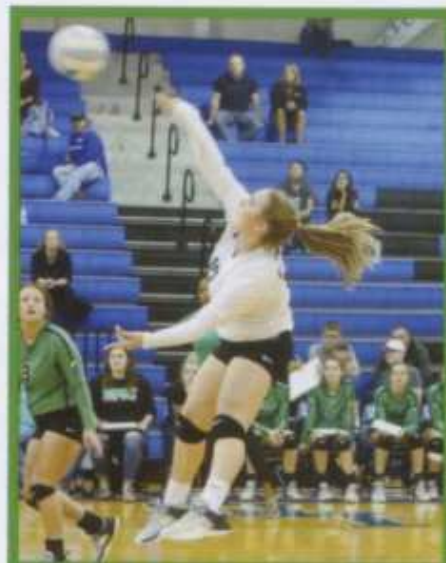
