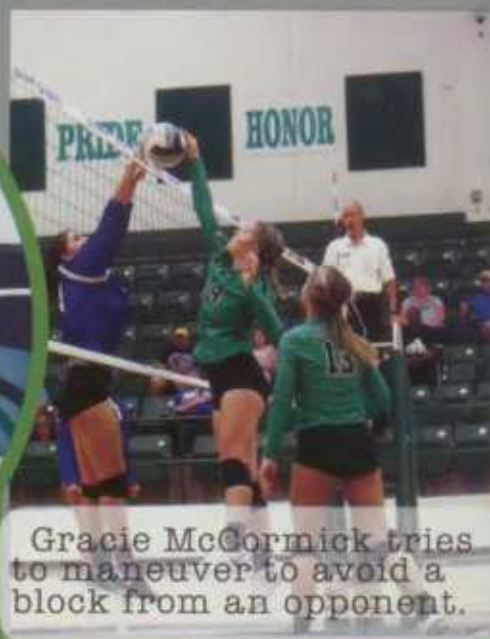

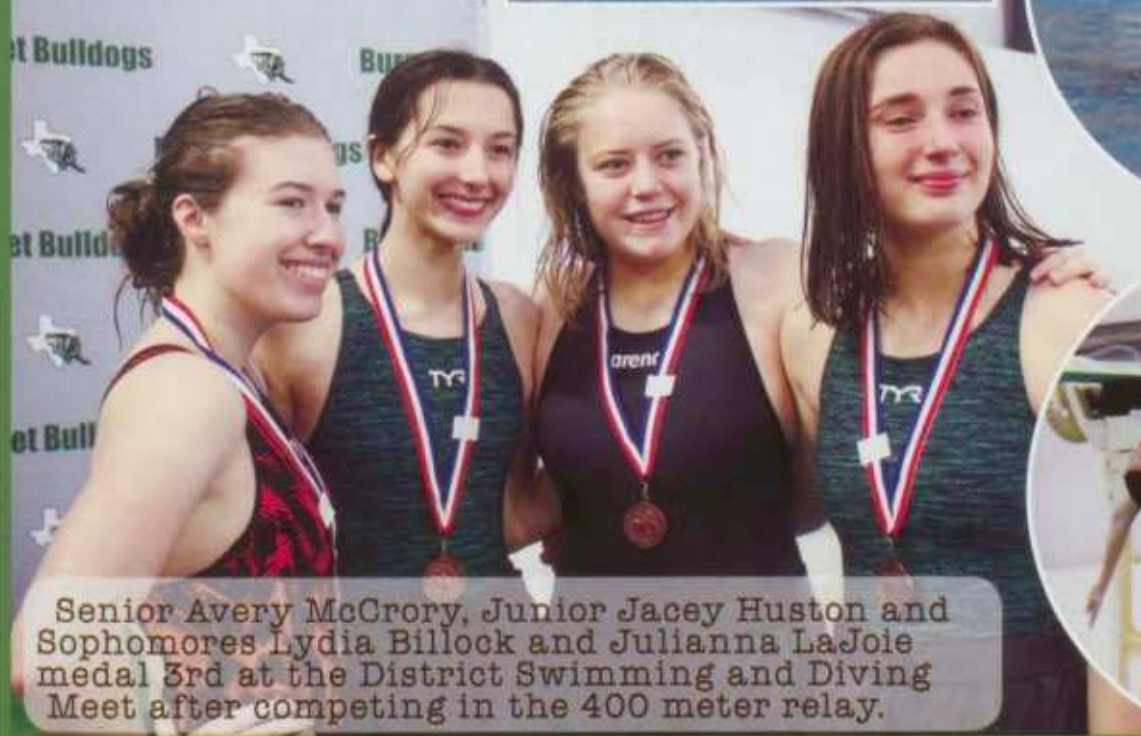

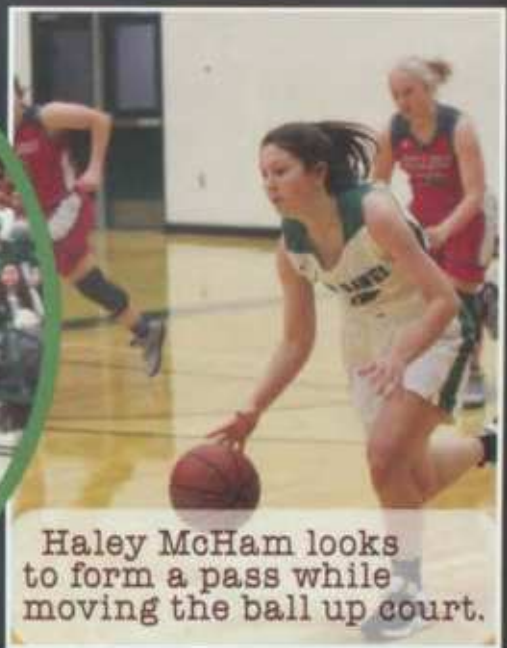

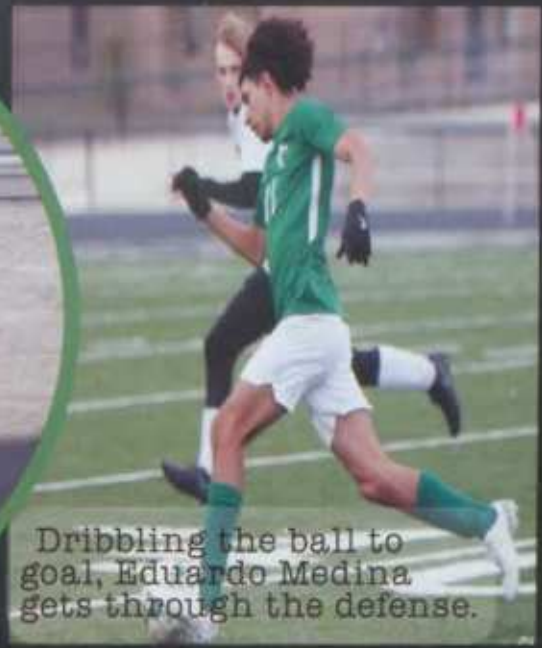

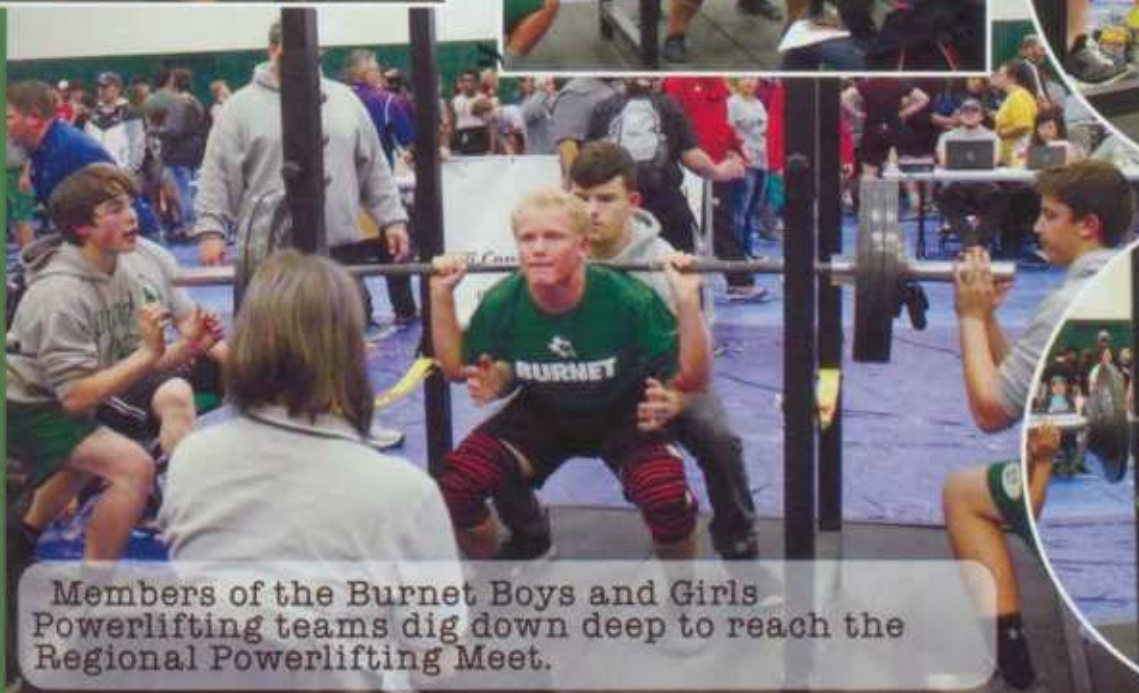

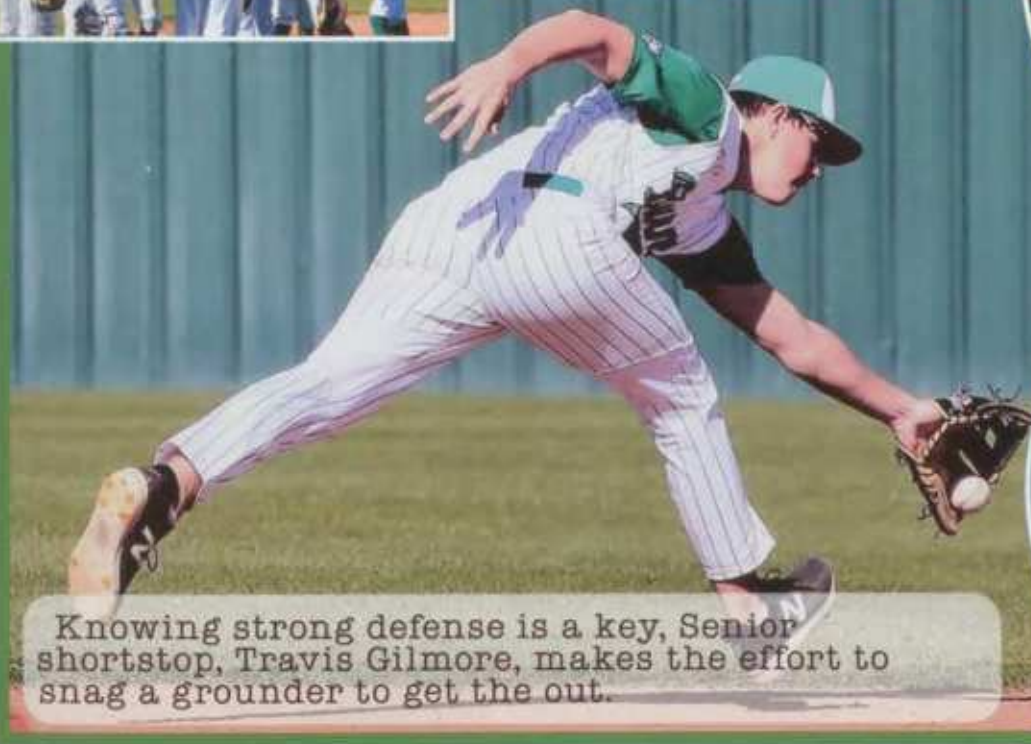

The coronavirus crisis upends life around the globe, causing panic, shutdowns and deaths

Unprecedented series of events

It was the virus felt around the world. In an unprecedented series of events, a new coronavirus dramatically changed life in the spring of 2020. COVID-19, the shortened name for coronavirus disease 2019, originated in Wuhan, China, in December. By March, there were cases across the globe. The World Health Organization classified the outbreak a pandemic, March 11. Three additional announcements that day would make the situation real and personal for Americans: the NBA suspended their season, President Donald Trump announced travel restrictions from Europe, and actor Tom Hanks announced he and his wife tested positive.

The ripple effects were immediate. The stock market plunged. The NCAA canceled the men's and women's basketball tournaments and spring seasons. Trump declared a national emergency. Shoppers scrambled to stores, filling their carts with disinfectant products, toilet paper and paper towels. In addition, they cleared shelves of milk, eggs, dairy, bread, canned goods and meat. Grocery stores worked rapidly to restock empty shelves, but couldn't keep up with demand.

Meanwhile, the Centers for Disease Prevention and Control continued to recommend prevention methods, including hand-washing, staying home and social distancing. The medical community struggled to stay healthy, provide testing and have enough equipment and beds. Local and state governments enacted shelter-in-place orders and mandated shutdowns of non-essential businesses. Schools, which had already extended spring breaks, contemplated distance learning for the rest of the semester. ABC News reported March 26, more than 90 percent of the world's children were not in school.

As streets emptied and businesses closed, more and more Americans found themselves without a job. As of late March, there were 3.3 million new applications for unemployment benefits. A week later, it doubled.

To stem the economic emergency, Congress passed a \$2 trillion stimulus package. The legislation provided financial assistance for citizens and businesses, including personal stimulus checks, funding for hard-hit hospitals and local governments, and loans for struggling businesses.

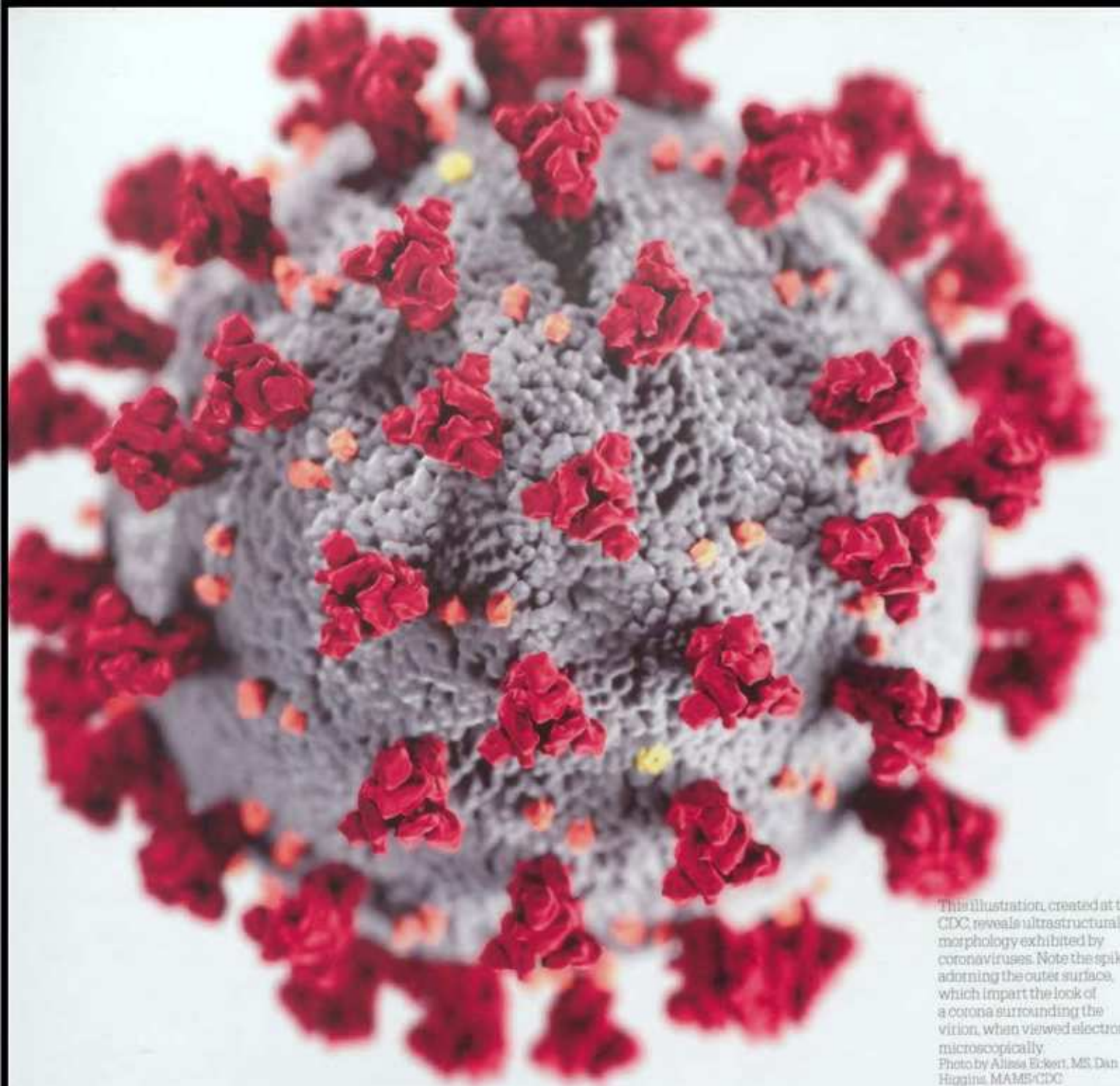


World maps as of March 26, 2020/CDC

A global impact

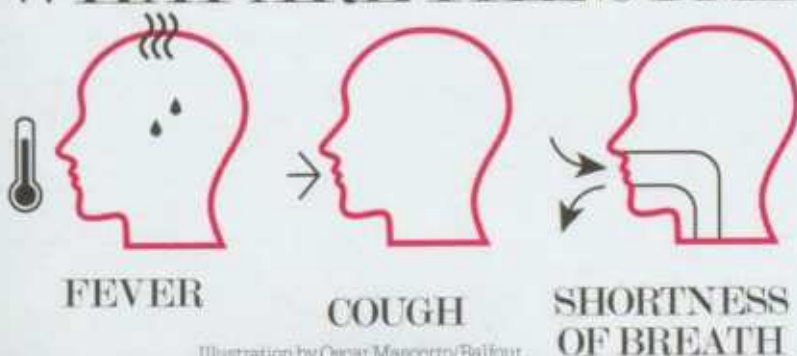
The World Health Organization reported early cases at the epicenter of the outbreak had some link to a seafood and live animal market. Later, person-to-person spread was reported outside Wuhan and in countries outside China. The mildness of symptoms in some people and the incubation period meant many people unknowingly spread the infection.

By April 6, the WHO reported more than 1.2 million confirmed cases, 68,000 deaths, and 203 countries, areas and territories with coronavirus cases. In the US, CDC records showed cases dramatically escalated from one reported Jan. 22 to more than 122,000 by March 29 and 331,000 by April 6. California, Washington and New York were some of the hardest hit states with more than 10,000 deaths nationwide by early April.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19?



"The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are fever, tiredness and dry cough. Some patients may have aches and pains, nasal congestion, runny nose, sore throat or diarrhea. These symptoms are usually mild and begin gradually. Some people become infected but don't develop any symptoms and don't feel unwell. Most people (about 80 percent) recover from the disease without needing special treatment. Around one out of every six people who gets COVID-19 becomes seriously ill and develops difficulty breathing. Older people, and those with underlying medical problems like high blood pressure, heart problems or diabetes, are more likely to develop serious illness. People with fever, cough and difficulty breathing should seek medical attention."

Pandemic causes school closures, global shutdowns and economic anxiety as the world faces COVID-19 outbreak

When a new coronavirus emerged in late 2019, no one knew it would become a global crisis in a matter of months. COVID-19 spread across the world, causing school closures, business shutdowns and economic anxiety.

China and Italy, who were the first two countries with massive cases and deaths, enacted dramatic lockdowns to reduce the spread. In the US, health care workers struggled with long hours, supply shortages and growing numbers of patients. Schools extended spring breaks and then transitioned to remote learning.

As consumers were asked to stay home and businesses temporarily closed, millions of Americans lost their jobs. Cities and states enacted shelter-in-place plans and asked people to practice social distancing.

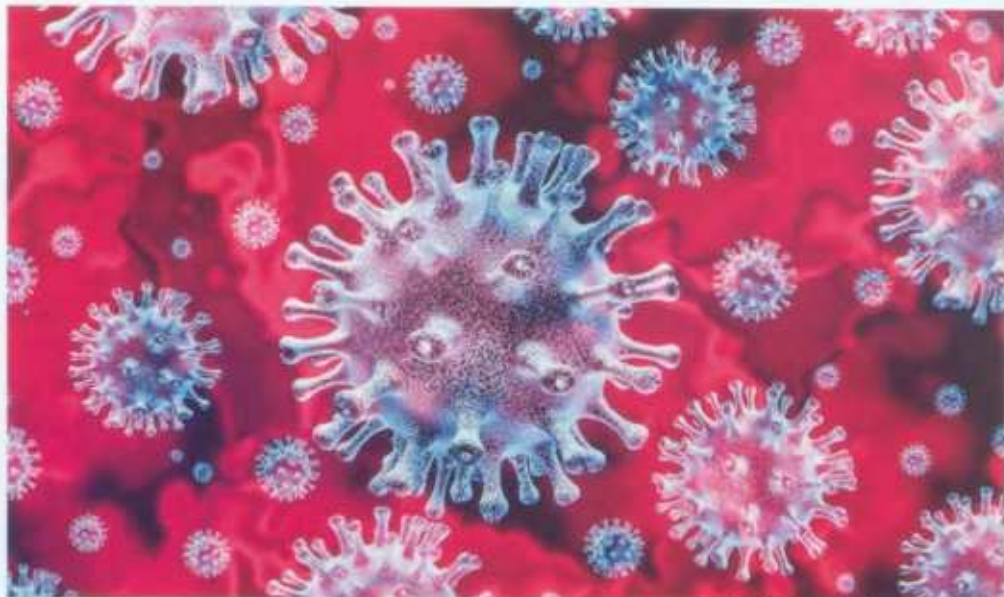

Jazz player tested positive for COVID-19. The NCAA swiftly followed suit, canceling the men's and women's basketball tournaments and all upcoming spring sports. The MLB and NHL also postponed their seasons. Middle and high school sports seasons ended when schools were unable to return to in-person classes. And the ultimate sporting event, the Olympics, was postponed until 2021.

Businesses close their doors, shoppers empty shelves



Empty shelves, like this meat section at a Texas H-E-B grocery store, were common during the coronavirus outbreak. Americans loaded up on toilet paper, paper towels, meat, canned goods and bread as they prepared to stay home during the pandemic.



As COVID-19 cases rapidly increased in the United States, local and state officials initiated shutdowns and shelter-in-place plans. Non-essential businesses like gyms, rec centers, libraries and nail salons closed their doors, as part of the prevention measures.



To combat the virus, citizens were encouraged to regularly wash their hands and disinfect frequently touched surfaces like phones, doors and faucets. Store employees also wiped down carts to keep customers safe and healthy.


